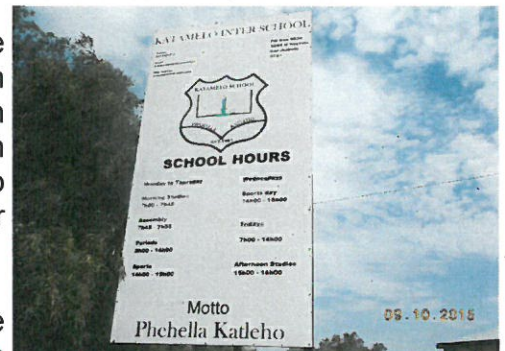


Women and Youth information session in Botshabelo

CENTLEC EMERGENCY DRILL

On the 15th of October 2015 CENTLEC (SOC) Ltd, had an Emergency drill at the premises in Rhodes Avenue. The main purpose of the Emergency Drill was to ensure that all CENTLEC employees have the necessary understanding and knowledge of where all assembly points are situated within the premises and how to respond in cases of disaster or emergency.

Emergency Drill Exercises are also conducted to check whether the Security Component of the particular institution have the data of all clients including the staff members who are on the premises, the right contact details to dial during the disaster and also determine the preciseness of the checklists and the expedience of the floor marshals in terms of evacuation of employees from various

offices during the disaster.

CENTLEC (SOC) Ltd, was declared a National Key Point in 30 June 2010 and is required to conform to the provisions of the Act which states that *all National Key Points must in terms of the National Key Point Act 102 of 1980 ensure that Emergency Drill Exercises are conducted annually.*

The (JPC) Joint Planning Committee was appointed to look at the safety of the National Key Points from the following divisions SSA,

SAPS, Disaster management, Ambulance, Fire department, Traffic department and other intelligence units.

In this years' event, exercises and scenarios related to the fire drill. The aim here was to determine the reaction and the response time of the Fire Engine, SAPS, Ambulance Services and the Traffic Department in case fire broke out at CENTLEC.

This was a very fruitful exercise for all our security personnel, floor marshals and all staff members as it has awakened and indicated the direction on what should be done in cases of emergency.

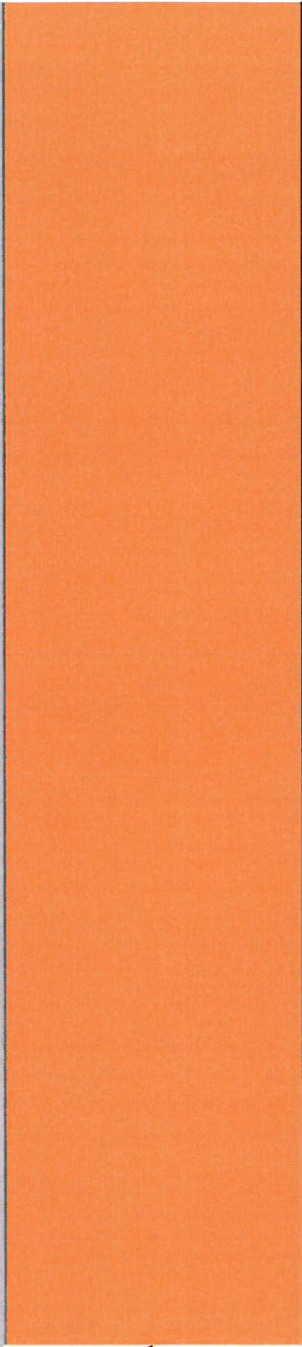

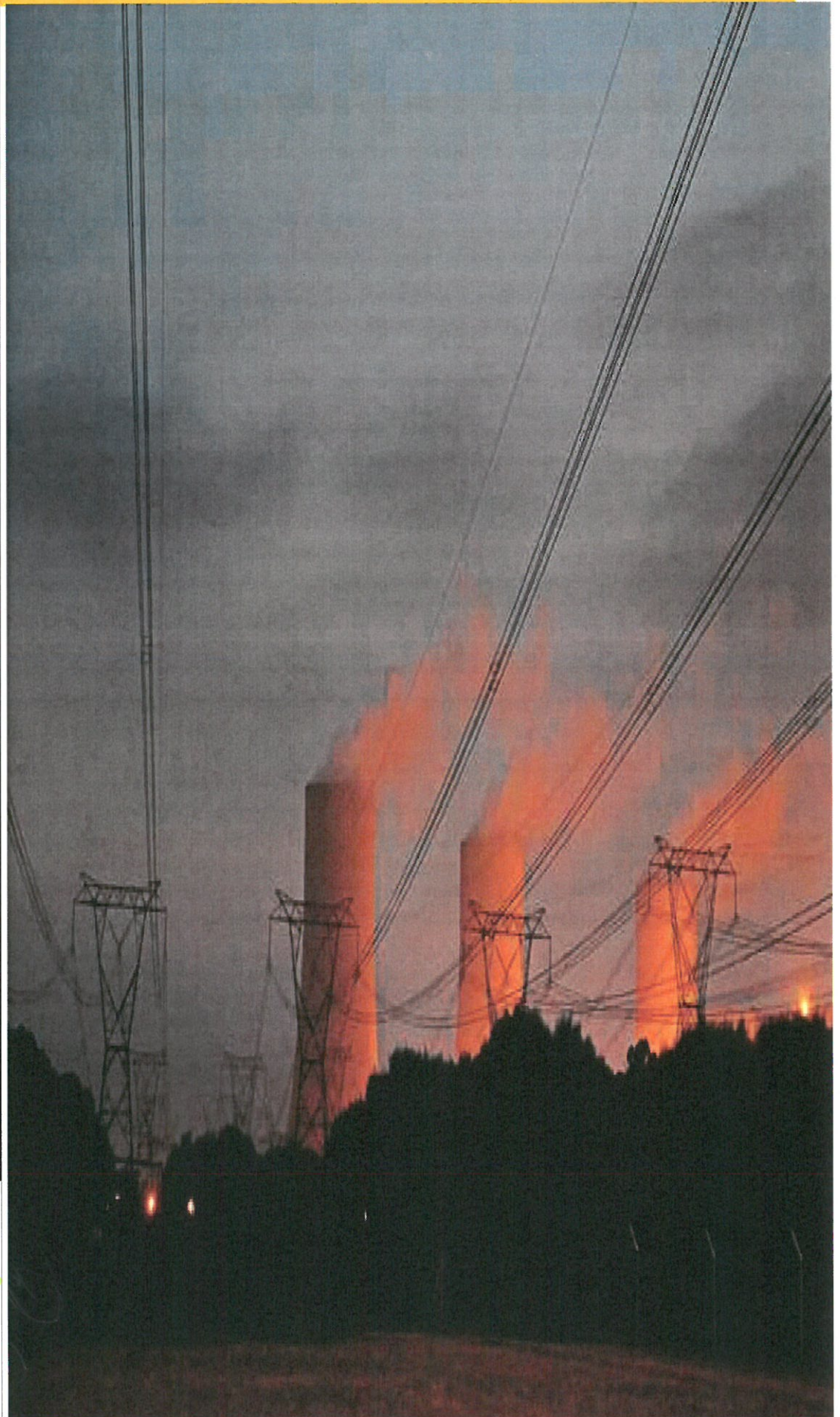
